MAYORAL CANDIDATES

RNA has invited the mayoral candidates to our February, March and April meetings in order for the community to hear and question them about their positions on issues of citywide and local concern. Mayoral hopefuls **Councilwoman Melissa Holloway**, **Louis Manzo** and **Gerald McCann** are scheduled for the March 13th meeting. Council candidates for Wards C and D have also been invited, including **Maureen Corcoran (D)** and **Walter McDermott (C)** from the Manzo ticket. February's quests were **Robert Cavanaugh** and **Glenn Cunningham**. Candidates **Tom DeGise** and **Kevin Sluka** will attend the April meeting.

As in the past, RNA will participate with other neighborhood groups to organize debates for both the Ward and Mayoral races.

VOTE: RNA ELECTIONS

RNA will elect its executive board at the March 13th meeting. Nominations were opened in February and will remain open until the end of the March meeting, at which time the election will take place.

To be eligible to vote, an individual must be eighteen years old, paid their annual dues and live or own property within the constitutional boundaries of the RNA, which are Ogden and Palisade Avenues from Cuneo Place to Congress Street.

To run for office, an individual, in addition to the above qualifications, must be a current resident living within the RNA boundaries and an active member.

COMMUNITY UPDATES

STEEP SLOPE PROTECTION: On March 3rd, members of four Heights associations, including RNA, **Sgt. Anthony**, **Heights Hope**, and the **Palisade Ave. Coalition** reviewed the Planning Department's proposal for a steep slope ordinance. These groups have been actively lobbying the City to pass a zoning law to protect the Palisade cliffs as a natural resource and limit development in the adjacent areas since the Millennium Towers crisis of last year.

Unfortunately, the City's draft is a watered-down version of the community's own proposal, lacking such features as specific boundaries for a slope district, priority over existing zoning including redevelopment plans, a mathematical formula to reduce building densities for all new construction, inadequate setbacks for both the top and bottom of the cliffs and an inclusion of view corridors.

At this time, the Planning Board is scheduled to hold public hearings on **March 6th** and **22nd** regarding this proposal which is part of a completely new zoning ordinance for Jersey City. The four groups have started to organize the community to speak out against this ineffective plan and lobby for stronger protections for the Palisades. RNA urges its members to attend both Board meetings. In addition, people interested in helping with this effort should attend RNA's March 13th meeting or contact their respective associations for more information.

PALISADE CLIFF BLIGHT STUDY: On February 14th, the City Council tabled a resolution that would have authorized the Planning Board to conduct a blight study of the Palisade cliffs and the area below, identified as "The New Neighborhood", as a redevelopment zone. On Saturday, February 24th, members of the same four neighborhood groups met with **Planning Director Robert Cotter** to discuss this issue. It was mutually agreed that the study would not be re-introduced until the protections of the above steep slope ordinance were reviewed and ratified into law.

I22-I24 OGDEN AVENUE: On March 1st, RNA joined with local neighbors to oppose an application before the Board of Adjustment to construct a mid-rise building consisting of 7 two-bedroom units and off-street parking at this location. The developers need seven variances to build this project because it is too large for the lot size. **City Planner Claire Davis** recommended that the Board deny this application and suggested that two 2-family structures be built there instead. The Board will vote on this application on **Thursday, March 22nd**. RNA urges all interested parties to attend this meeting in support of your neighbors and protect your community from overdevelopment.
