Life Goes On

Two weeks after the September 11th tragedy, a full moon is shining over the City's skyline and the smoke is finally clearing from ground zero. From its vantage point on the Palisades, our community witnessed this catastrophe and every day since views the aftermath. Members of our neighborhood have been personally affected by this event, either by surviving the attack itself or mourning loved ones. There have been poignant articles and columns - both local and national - that describe the horrors of that day and the dreaded consequences that it portends.

People have acted heroically. City workers like **Glenn Cunningham** of the Incinerator Authority volunteered during the first days to work at the site. **Jersey City Fire Captain Christopher Salmon** with several comrades ventured through the Path tunnels to find any survivors under the Trade Center's train station. Local residents came together on Friday, September 14th in Riverview-Fisk Park to light candles and mourn the victims.

GUEST SPEAKERS at OCTOBER MEETING

RNA has invited **Councilman Steve Lipski** and **Police Captain Joseph Pizzelanti** of the North District to our October 9th meeting. Steve Lipski was recently elected as the council representative for Ward C. Traditionally known as the Journal Square ward, the district extends north along Ogden and Palisade Avenues to Franklin Street. He will be asked to address topics of local concern, including the completion of the street repaving along Palisade Avenue, a review of the permit parking times in our neighborhood and NJ Transit's current excavation project under the Palisades.

Captain Pizzelanti is the recently appointed commander of the North District. He and his new executive officer, **Lieut. Robert Kilduf**, were unable to attend last month's meeting because of the Trade Center catastrophe. We will discuss the need for greater police patrols in our neighborhoods and parks.

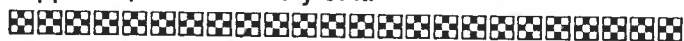

MEETING

MINUTES: September 11, 2001

The September meeting was overshadowed by the catastrophic events that had occurred earlier in the day at the World Trade Center. However, six community minded members made their way to the Harbor View's second floor sun room Tuesday night to meet with **Bill Gaughan**, recently re-elected as Councilman of Ward D.

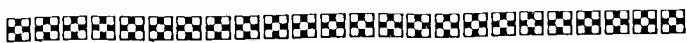
The first topic Bill addressed was the long-over due paving of Palisade Avenue. The original contractor had sold their interests to another company, Tellcon. It appears that the two companies were now disagreeing on what part of the Palisade Avenue contract, Tellcon would be responsible for. In an attempt to expedite the repaving, the City was meeting with representatives of the two companies on Friday to sort the matter out.

[At press time, the Councilman informed RNA that the meeting with the two companies had taken place and the paving of the Avenue should begin before the end of the year. In another development, the Department of Public Works (DPW) was going to fill in the portions of the street along the curb to facilitate street cleaning because of complaints made at the September 26th Council meeting by Avenue residents.]

It was pointed out to the Councilman that the side streets in our neighborhood were also in need of repair. In response, Bill stated that he had recently completed created a list of "bad" streets and gave them to the DPW for repair.

The next topic brought up was the need to review the amount of hours and days of restricted parking under the current permit parking ordinance for

our community. Gaughan said he would like to meet with all the neighborhood associations to discuss proposed changes because both Ward C and D would be affected by any new parking rules.

There was a discussion about the problem of organized soccer and volleyball playing in Riverview-Fisk Park this summer and the resultant deterioration of the lawns. Gaughan suggested that the City explore leasing space in Liberty State Park for this type of sports activity because currently all municipal fields are being utilized to their fullest.

Bill updated the group on the progress of the construction of the new firehouse on Palisade Avenue and Congress Street.

Finally, the group urged the Councilman to prioritize the renovation of the eastern portion of Riverview-Fisk Park, which RNA has been lobbying the City to start for the last ten years.

The meeting started at 7:55 PM and ended at 8:40 PM.
