Postman Assaulted

When is the police department going to once and for all clean up the intersection of Palisade Ave. and Franklin St.? On February 22nd one of our local letter carriers was attacked at the intersection of Franklin and Ogden. Fortunately, a full recovery from the injuries is eventually expected. The attackers were three 15-year-old males and one 14-year-old female, all are students of Dickinson High School. All four have been arrested by the police. This comes one month after a murder of a drug dealer by two other drug dealers - all on the same block. The community has complained for years about this intersection and the surrounding block radius. Notorious for drug dealing, loitering and hanging out, this intersection continually breeds crimes of one kind or another. Now they are more violent, deadly and happening in broad daylight! Community Updates

Stop & Shop/Reservoir 3: On February 23rd the Heights Pride Committee sponsored an appreciation dinner for Mayor Healy and Councilmen Gaughan and Lipski for supporting the Heights Community's opposition to the proposed Super Stop & Shop. Mayor Healy announced on January 13th his support of the Jersey City Master Plan's residential zoning of the proposed site. This, in conjunction with protecting and preserving Reservoir 3 as open space, will keep the urban integrity of the Heights and protect the local businesses of Central Avenue.

800 Jackson Street: Mayor Dave Roberts of Hoboken has apparently reneged on his support for a park at this site as the Hoboken Master Plan calls for. On March 2 an ordinance will go before the Hoboken City Council to allow for an increased "floor area ratio" that would essentially create a taller building than what is currently allowed. This, along with maneuvering by the developer of 900 Monroe to include that site in the current neighboring redevelopment zone, is threatening the views of the Palisade Cliff and the Manhattan views of residents along Paterson Plank Road and the Doric Apartments.
