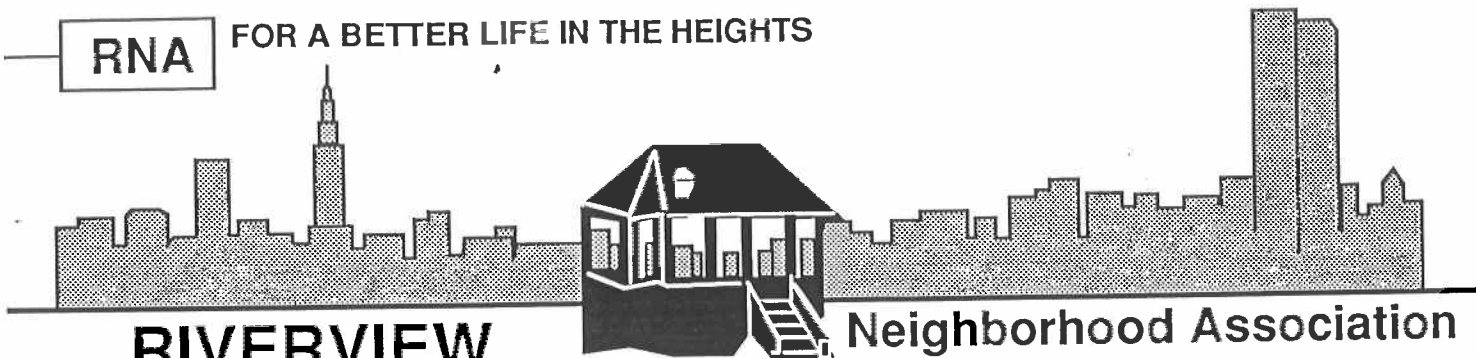

RNA would like to say a word about the outgoing officers, Vice-chair Greg Brickey and Secretary Kathy Packard. Both of these individuals worked to improve the quality of life for all the residents in our neighborhood. Greg was and will continue to be a motivating force behind the Riverview Community Garden which is now a permanent fixture of our Park. Kathy will continue to work with RNA by helping prepare our application for tax-exempt status. Their advice and energy have set a standard for the new officers to emulate.

VOTE ON JUNE 10th IN RUN-OFF ELECTION

RNA strongly encourages all its members, neighbors and friends to vote in the municipal run-off election on Tuesday, June 10th. There are two important council positions - Ward C and Council-at-large - that will be decided that day. (This does not count the possible mayoral run-off which will be determined in court in the coming weeks.) Part of RNA, from Franklin Street south to Cuneo Place, is within the boundary of Ward C. Therefore it is important that we are represented by someone who will protect our local interests and work with us to improve our area.

The same goes for the three At-large councilpersons who must represent the entire City. The people elected to these positions should be aware of the specific problems of the Heights and be responsive to the needs of its residents, including RNA.

As usual, RNA does not endorse any candidate. However, when deciding who to vote for in each of these races, voters should consider what each candidate will do to improve the quality of life in our community on Palisade and Ogden Avenues from Cuneo Place to Congress Street.

GAUGHAN RE-ELECTED in WARD D

RNA would like to congratulate Bill Gaughan on his re-election as councilman for Ward D. He was the only candidate in the recent municipal election that won on the first ballot. During his first term, RNA worked with Mr. Gaughan to get state funding to reopen our two mountain roads. (The plans of which are presently being developed by the Engineering Division.) In his second term, RNA will work with him to renovate Palisade Avenue.

RNA ANNUAL FLEA MARKET

RNA will hold its 13th annual flea market on Saturday, June 7th. As usual, there will be a wide variety of vendors selling their wares throughout Riverview-Fisk Park. In addition, there will be several food vendors selling hotdogs and delicious homemade items. RNA will also present live entertainment at the pavilion, including local musical groups (Cherry Flip and Joey George), a storyteller, poets, and hopefully our resident magician, Tony Scarpa. Tony, of SDS Bikes on Palisade Avenue, will also donate a bicycle for a RNA raffle to be held during the day.

RNA table to sell donated items: Look for various items that you are not using or not in need of anymore. All items, including clothing, should be in fairly good condition. Bring these items to the RNA Table, which will be located north of the park pavilion, the morning of the flea market.

Coffee and cake table: Homemade and store bought goods will be accepted. These bakery products should be brought to the coffee table the morning of the flea market. Use disposable pans or plates.

Plant table: RNA will sell plants and flowers for our Park fund.

MEETING

MINUTES: May 13, 1997

The meeting opened with a continuation of the nominations for RNA officers, and closed with the RNA elections, after a two months delay, to place the new officers for 1997. The new team is Chair, Vito Brunetti; Vice Chair, Maria Tuzzo; Secretary, Alison Fontana-Ferrara; Treasurer, Jack Rea; Sgt.-at-Arms, Carol Rebelowski.

COMMUNITY POLICING:

Mike Maffei, NFT Officer from a neighboring post, spoke and took comments from the floor. He reported that the police are aware of drug activities in the area, and asked that residents provide help in catching drug dealers. He suggested that a detailed description, including clothing, shoes, etc, could help identify suspects.

He noted that spring and summer are expected to be busy on Palisade Av., and the hotter the weather, the worse the problems will be.

On the topic of double parking on Palisade Av., he said that officers usually move the cars on, and occasionally give tickets.

OUR PARKS:

Louis Ramos, caretaker for Janet Moore Park, and Damien Holloway, the new caretaker for Riverview Fisk Park, spoke briefly about their roles. Damien will be the contact for city agencies for park work, and will keep the park clean, perform maintenance and landscaping. Damien will be in the park weekdays before 11 am, and on weekends all day.

There was a discussion of possible projects for Riverview Park, including a dog run, repairs to the fence along the cliff, repair or removal of the water fountain, east side renovation, and the completion of the fencing around the playground. There was also discussion of summer basketball, volleyball, and a cleanup of the cliffside.

FLEA MARKET:

Plans for the Flea Market were discussed. Volunteers are needed for setup, closing, and cleanup. A form is in the newsletter for volunteers to register to help. Thanks to Valerie Rea, this year's porta-john is free of charge. Clean, useful, saleable items are needed for the RNA table; bring them to the flea market early that day. Potted plants are needed to sell at the plant table, which benefits park projects.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

1) A dumpster weekend is planned for the weekend of May 30, with two dumpsters to be placed on Hobson St. and Franklin St. There was some doubt about the Franklin location, which would probably be switched to Ferry St.; signs will be posted if the location changes.

2) RNA is looking for a coordinator for its annual neighborhood cleanup.

3) The Riverview Community Garden is open, and plots are still available. Gardeners regularly meet at

noon on Saturdays, and later in the season, also on Wednesdays.

4) Two summer concerts are planned in Riverview-Fisk Park. On July 9, a blues band will play, and on August 6, Rock & Roll.

5) For control of raccoons and water rats, contact Animal Control, who can provide traps for a \$70 deposit. Or call Billy Rodolfos, NID Manager for the north part of RNA's territory, who can also help with non-lethal methods of control.

The theme is a tribute to the "City-Wide Mural Program", in which professional and student artists paint quality large scale murals on the most visible vacant walls in each ward of the City.

This multi-cultural event will present over 100 displays of art and crafts, two performance stages featuring a variety of dance and musical groups, ethnic foods and civic and church associations.

SUMMERFEST '97

From Valerie's Kitchen:

Nantucket Scallop Chowder

INGREDIENTS:

- 4 tablespoons butter.
- 1 cup diced potatoes.
- 2 small sliced onions.
- 1 pint scallops, cut small.
- 2 cups boiling water.
- 4 cups scaled milk.
- salt and pepper.
- common crackers, split and toasted.

- 1) Melt butter, lightly brown onions in butter.
- 2) Remove onions, cook scallops in butter for 5 minutes.
- 3) Add boiling water, onions and potatoes, and simmer 30 minutes.
- 4) Add scaled milk and simmer another 15 minutes.
- 5) Season to taste. Serve hot with crackers. Serves 5.

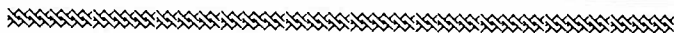

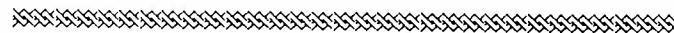

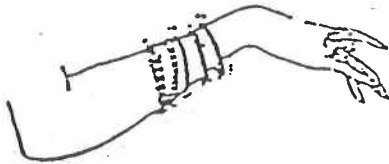
