DO WE NEED PERMIT PARKING IN OUR COMMUNITY?

At the July 13th meeting, RNA will discuss a long ignored problem in our neighborhood: the scarcity of available street parking for local residents and the continual problem of additional vehicles parking on our streets. It is time to consider several solutions that the City is willing to institute once there is a consensus among the residents. Permit parking has been successfully implemented in several areas of the City. Permit parking preserves street parking for the local residents by limiting the use of local streets for parking by non-residents to several hours a day (usually 2 hours). After that their vehicles would be subject to a parking summons and afterwards, the installation of a boot. A resident on the other hand would be eligible for a \$5.00/year parking permit allowing them to unlimited parking in the area.

The other idea is to install metered parking along several areas of Palisade Avenue between Griffith Street and Cuneo Place. This would prevent vehicles from tying up valuable parking space on the Avenue for several days and give customers immediate access to our local businesses.

RNA has discussed both of these ideas with Carmine Venezia of the Parking Authority. With the City's commitment to implement a revitalization plan for Palisade Avenue next year - it is time to address this issue now. Because of its importance, RNA is extending a special invitation to all local residents and business owners to attend this meeting to give their opinions.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

This summer, members of RNA's P & D Committee will be busy at work reviewing plans and meeting with developers of several local projects in our neighborhood.

235 Ogden Avenue: the proposed conversion of an old warehouse into residential apartments. The developers must apply for parking variances from the City.

253 Ogden Avenue: the construction of a two family unit. Developer has presented plans for modular construction. There are concerns about parking and a third apartment.

346-352 Ogden Avenue: the developer has been granted approval to subdivide the property into three lots. Construction has recently begun to erect three two family units. There are concerns about building on the sloped cliff and the committee will review the site plan.

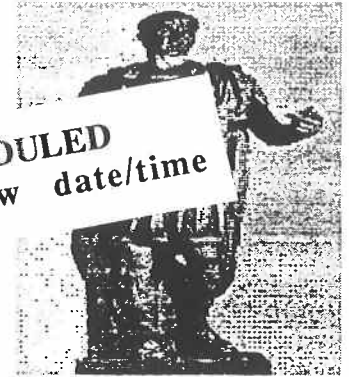
