MEETING MINUTES

At the March meeting of the RNA, our members were given a brief preview of a new plan by Ward D Councilman Dan Waddleton to displace drug dealers from their hangouts on Palisade Avenue. Part of the plan includes a public rally to take place on April 28th. While plans were still in the making, the councilman has promised full details at the next meeting. (See article on frontpage.)

RNA discussed plans for our annual flea market. The call has gone out for a coordinator for this year's event, and a date of June 15th has been picked for the event.

We also had a surprise guest speaker, the Rev. George Swenson, pastor of the Church of the Ascension, the Episcopal church that burned down on New York Avenue about five years ago. Father Swenson told the group of the current status regarding the rebuilding of the church and the continuing struggle with the Diocese of Newark for the release of the insurance funds necessary for the construction of the new building. He also made the members aware of the on-going services and facilities available at his "Charcoal Chapel". The church is located on south Street between Palisade and New York Avenue. CONRAD'S CORNER

Since the war in the Persian Gulf and our economy at home collapsing, our environmentalists seem to have crept into a shell. There doesn't seem to be much talk anymore about pollution, and preservationists seem to be hibernating. All the while this could be a golden opportunity to have the state Green Acres Program take over the Palisades along the Heights in our neighborhood. Real estate values are now down to their lowest in ten years with some thirty percent of development vacant.

There has been so much talk about development by the Chamber of Commerce, real estate developers and politicians but nothing about preserving open space. In fact, the City assessor looks upon any vacant lot as land that should be build on when the opportunity to build becomes profitable again. The thought of keeping some open space in congested areas is never even considered.

It should be part of any planned community to reduce taxes for anyone maintaining vacant land as parkland.

A reduction in taxes for vacant land to about one quarter of the commercial rate could bring about some beautiful landscaped areas at no cost to the City, and provide the necessary vegetation for cleaner air.

All the unplanned development along the waterfront which was supposed to reduce taxes for the inner city has raised them instead and spoiled the beautiful vistas of New York by high rise buildings paying only thirty percent of taxes.

Let's start planning now to preserve open space before we lose what little there is left.

INCREASED COST OF NEWSLETTER

RNA has been publishing this newsletter for over the last five years. It is dedicated to the ideal of disseminating information to the local community to apprise the people of issues, problems and matters that will effect their lives. The mailing list has steadily increased till its present number of approximately 450 people. These newsletters circulate through the local RNA neighborhoods, the Heights, Jersey City, Hudson County and even as far as the Governor's mansion in Trenton. (Our two U.S. Senators are also on our mailing list.) RNA believes it is just as important to let people outside, as well as inside, the area know what is going on in this community. This newsletter has grown from one page to sometimes as many as ten pages including a coloring page and a page of local sponsors.

Unfortunately, the cost of this newsletter has steadily increased because of the ever changing mailing rates. RNA has decided to effect a policy to help maintain this local paper. Therefore, at the March RNA meeting, it was decided that we ask all people presently on the mailing list and receiving the newsletter to help defray the cost by paying the annual \$3.00 membership fee. If we do not receive, a subscription within two months, we will have to remove the person's name from the mailing list. RNA regrets having to institute this policy but the economics dictate that in order to continue to publish the paper, it is necessary. Thank you for your understanding and we hope your continued support.

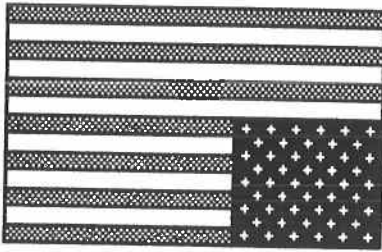

HOMESTEAD REBATE PROGRAM

YOU MAY BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE UP TO \$500 FROM THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY IF YOU ARE A RENTER OR HOMEOWNER. YOU MUST FILE A N.J. 1040 STATE TAX FORM. THE REBATE IS PART OF THE FORM THIS YEAR. THE FORMS CAN BE OBTAINED FROM THE LIBRARY OR THE POST OFFICE. FILL OUT THE FORM TO LINE 19C, SIGN AND COMPLETE THE REBATE APPLICATION ON THE BACK OF THE 1040 FORM.
