## PETITION TO REOPEN MOUNTAIN ROAD

At our October meeting, it was decided that RNA would actively begin a petition drive to reopen Mountain Road. It was Mayor McCann who suggested, at our September meeting, that if we as a neighborhood wanted to have the City reopen this cobblestoned road, he would need some evidence of the community's commitment.

Mountain Road, is the winding street, located on the Palisades between Ogden Avenue/Franklin Street and Hope Street and Paterson Plank Road, which connects Jersey City Heights and Hoboken. The City closed the Road over five years ago with plans to convert the area into a cliffside park. The RNA has always officially wanted the Road to be reopened because of its value as a connection between the Heights and the rest of Jersey City and Hoboken.

The area has deteriorated since the Road has been closed. It has become a "no-man's land" for drug dealing, garbage and construction dumping, abandoned autos and an accessway, from the Hoboken projects to our streets, for the criminal elements now in our neighborhood. Because of the highway barriers across the Road, the police complain that they are unable to drive their autos on the Road to patrol the area. There is practically never any City maintenance or clean-up efforts on the Road. There has also been an increase in the number of robberies and break-ins on properties bordering the Road. The area has become a weed infested area, literally abandoned by the City.

Therefore the two main reasons to reopen the Road are as follows:

a) to control the flow of drugs and crime into our neighborhood by having daily police patrols cover the area by car, and foot if necessary, and

b) to provide a greater access, for the local community, to the waterfront projects, Hoboken and New York City via either of the two Hudson River tunnels.

In addition, RNA is asking for the following conditions to be attached to the reopening of Mountain Road:

- 1) that the street traffic should only flow in one direction, from west to east,
- 2) that trucks should be banned from the Road,
- 3) that there should be a specific speed limit,
- 4) that there be daily police patrols on the Road,

5) that the appropriate lighting, highway barriers and fencing be provided for both vehicular and pedestrian access and safety on the Road,

6) that the sidewalks and road surface be repaired,

7) that there be regular landscaping and sanitation efforts to prevent dumping and properly maintain the Road,

8) and lastly, that Holland Street, north of Riverview Park, also be reopened as a one way street from east to west, as a companion route.

If people are interested in helping in this effort to collect signatures, please come to our next meeting on Friday, November 8 to pick-up the necessary petition forms.

### RNA HELPS THE ASCENSION CHURCH

(At our last meeting, RNA voted to donate a monetary contribution to the rebuilding effort of the Church of the Ascension. The following is an excerpt from the Church's acknowledgement.)

Thanks to the members of the RNA, Ascension is being restored as a neighborhood center and also a place of worship.

So far we have filled two large dumpsters with the help of many volunteers and three paid workers. A good percentage of the fire and water damaged material has been removed. Our volunteer crew has also drilled a hole for the water main through 21 inches of bluestone foundation, hooked up running water, and put lights and electric outlets in the kitchen. More demolition remains to be done. Then....rebuilding. If members of RNA would be willing to help in the physical work, they would be welcome.

Twenty five people have given a total of almost \$3,000. including one local bank.

We think that we are meant primarily to build the church of God's own human family, welcoming more and more real people into the circle of neighbors and friends around the altar of God. And we think that we are also meant to build the real church where people can meet for worship, neighborhood service and FUN.

Last month, RNA discussed the ongoing sanitation problems occurring in front of 385 Palisade Avenue. For over a year, the tenants who live at this property have continuously dumped their garbage and debris on the sidewalk and street. The property has incurred sanitation violations with fines totaling over thousands of dollars. Sanitation Inspector Ray Spellmeyer has attempted many times to get this owner into court in order to pay his fines and to stop this offense.

RNA has found out that the owner of this property is Raymond A. Murphy, Jr. who lives at 20 Van Brunt, in Englewood, New Jersey. The next court date for this owner is November 14th at 1:30 pm at the Municipal Court on Montgomery Street. Anyone interested in testifying about this deplorable and intolerable situation, should come to court on this date.

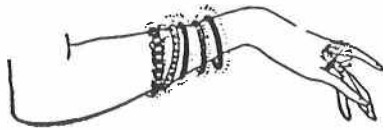
